

2. IPSC Dance Competition: The AVS was the first school to perform the dance form of Assam- Sattriya, in North India in the IPSC competition. Mirror by Michael Jackson and concluding with The Rhythm of Life, the students poured their hearts into the performance.




DANCE PRODUCTION
